Each spring and fall for two days the museum hosts a World War II remembrance day. While on a recent outing with the Katy Railroad Historical Society (Missouri-Kansas-Texas RR), I came across the Cadillac pictured at the top of the next page. The car caught my eye due to its unique blue exterior color. There was no model badging on the car, and I am not familiar enough with this era of Cadillacs to deduce model and year. It does have two fender vents per side, both above and behind the front wheel. Are these addons or decals? The car has a burgundy pinstripe

and similar accents on the fender vent, lower rocker sills, lower B-pillar trim and wheel center caps. I assume this must be a "custom"? If anyone has any thoughts or comments on this Cadillac, let your Secretary know. I can report feedback in a future edition.

Each year *Old Cars Weekly* magazine solicits car club magazines and newsletters for review and judging. The selected publications meeting the criteria the judges value are honored with Golden Quill Awards.

Categories for judging are based on distribution scope (national or regional) and page count. Regional and chapter club publication categories are: Full Size (21 or more pages); Intermediate Size (13-20 pages); and Compact (12 or fewer pages).

It is with great pride and pleasure that I announce that the *Fleetwood Flyer (FF)* has won an *Old Cars* 2023 Golden Quill Award in the Regional-Compact category!


As I stated when the FF was recognized first by the National-CLC as a newsletter of Merit and then of Excellence, the FF is truly a TEAM EFFORT.


Dr. Gerald Perschbacher, chief judge for the annual Golden Quill Awards, stated "...a club's publication is a timeless record of the hobby in a set region or on a specific slice of the hobby...". And "key factors in judging include balanced content, visuals, accuracy, creativity, technical tips, data and design—plus service to readers".

"When judging publications, we look for stories on members and their vehicles and sharply reproduced images of member vehicles," Angelo Van Bogart, editor for *Old Cars* said. "A club publication should serve its members by connecting them with each other and ways to enjoy the hobby, including through social events—including before and after coverage of these events—plus tips to restoring and maintaining their vehicles. Tips can come in the form of stories or advertisements that help members repair their vehicles and/or lead them to part sources. Tips might also include how-to stories. Ideally, it's a mix of both." "As judges, we also look for interesting historical stories that enrich members' hobby knowledge," Van Bogart added.

"It seems every car club, regardless of size, is interested in building its future by expanding membership to younger generations, which is good for the future of the hobby," said Van Bogart. "That's the way it should be. Each issue builds for the future."



Cadillac Servicemen were the first in our country to be confronted with a V-8 type engine in 1915. You can just picture the awe on their faces when they raised the side of the hood of a 1915 Model 51 and saw this husky 70 horsepower V-8 engine. With this engine, Cadillac also introduced thermostatic control of the cooling system—another Cadillac first in the automotive industry.
