SECRETARY'S REPORT

June Meeting: Our June 29th meeting was held at the Kirkwood Sonic Drive-In. We had another great turnout of 27 members. Other than a passing 5-minute rain-sprinkle before the start of the meeting, the weather cooperated with the sky clearing and temps holding in the low-80s.

Treasurer Ted reports our treasury balance is a tad below five grand. So, the Club has capacity for future donations to worthwhile organizations and charities that we support. Our September Club meeting will be held at the Wheels In Motion Car Show for the benefit of the National Children's Cancer Society to which we have previously donated.

July Meeting: Associate Director David Baker discussed our July meeting to be held on July 29th at Gateway Classic Cars (GCC) in O'Fallon, IL. We will participate in GCC's monthly Caffeine

& Chrome Car Show. Our St. Louis Region will be one of the featured clubs. Please heed the July "Meeting Notes", if you plan to attend. If showing a car, please plan to arrive by 8:30 am.

Fall Car Show: Next, David and Brandon Gray discussed our Fall Car Show to be held Saturday, October 7th at the Elks Lodge on Ladue Road in Creve Coeur. As previously mentioned we will join the Jaguar Club of St. Louis and its annual car show. More details will be provided closer in time to the event.

Brandon, who is coordinating the event for both clubs, stated that the Jaguar Club will arrive around 9 am to set up, as their show is judged and will also include an evening awards banquet. It is expected that CLC vehicles will be asked to arrive in the 10 am to 11 am time frame, and plan to stay until 3 pm. Brandon said that the show field location as viewed from Ladue Road generates a lot of drive-by traffic drop-ins to view the cars.

The show will have a DJ playing music, and there are plans for a catered, buffet-style lunch being served, which is included in the registration fee for the Jaguar Club. Members at our June meeting were polled on their interest in purchasing access to the buffet, and all present expressed interest. The cost would be in the \$15-\$20/person range. RSVP's and likely prepayment will be required closer in time to the event.

Past Fall shows have featured pizza provided to members by our Sponsor ELCO Cadillac. Because of the joint-nature of this Fall show, Club members were interested in participating in the Jaguar Club buffet. In lieu of providing pizza this year, maybe ELCO would be willing to provide a new Cadillac vehicle for display at our show? Inquiries will be made.

Fall Car Tour: David next talked of the Fall Car Tour to be held jointly with the Rolls Royce Club. As listed in the Event/Show Updates and Calendar, this will be a tour to the Kansas City area with visits to three auto collections—both public and private. Other sites of interest may include the Arabia Steamboat Museum and the National World War I Museum. Although final details are still in the planning stages, the event's dates are FIXED, October 13th to 15th (Friday-Sunday) with a potential optional choice to stay until Monday, October 16th. The anticipated hotel will be located on the Kansas City Country Club Plaza, a well known shopping and entertainment district, and will have an underground parking garage.

<u>August Meeting</u>: Post-June meeting, it has been confirmed our August meeting will include a tour of the private auto collection of Wayne and Melba Nolan. Their collection is located in Imperial, MO, a short drive south of St. Louis. The Nolan collection is extensive, consisting of roughly 45 primarily pre-war cars. Dodge Brothers is one of the favorite marques. There are representative examples of Dodge Brothers cars annually from 1915 to 1920, plus examples from 1927 and 1928. There are also several examples of Moon, Chevrolet, and Buick. You will also view some lesscommon makes such a Dort, Gardner, Graham, Maxwell, Overland, Star, Studebaker, and Traffic. One of the more recent acquisitions is a 1935 Chrysler Airflow.

The meeting and collection tour will be on Sunday, August 20th at 1 pm. There is also the potential for a late lunch/early dinner at a nearby restaurant around 3:30 pm for those interested. More details to follow in August.

GRAND NATIONAL 2024 & BEYOND

Details and hotel information for the 2024 Grand National (GN) are starting to be released. The GN will be June 10th to 15th in Gettysburg, PA. Gettysburg is about a 775 mile, 12.5 hour drive from downtown



St. Louis on Highways I-70 and I-76, passing through Indianapolis, IN, Columbus, OH, and just south of Pittsburg, PA.

In addition to all of the historical sites, monuments and museums in the area, you are also no more than an hour's drive away from the Antique Automobile Club of America Museum in Hershey, PA and the Rolls-Royce Foundation in Mechanicsburg, PA.

The host hotels will be the Wyndham-Gettysburg and the Courtyard by Marriott-Gettysburg. These hotels sit side-by-side and I anticipate that the show field will occupy the parking lot space between them. The link below to the National CLC Forum has 2024 GN details and host hotel links:

TOOL REVEW 13 in. Long-Reach Compound Joint Pliers

The May newsletter had a tool review on "Parrot-Nose" locking pliers that I purchased thinking they would be very handy at some point when that

special "need" arose.

I have since purchased a few more special-use pliers to further bolster my pliers arsenal. This month's review is on the Harbor Freight (HF) Quinn 13 in. Long-Reach Compound Joint Pliers.

Since changing their marketing strategy to eliminate their previously ubiquitous 20%-Off coupons, the dedicated tool addict must now closely monitor the product-specific and limited-use coupons HF "drops" on their website each Friday and semi-monthly. I discovered these pliers during one of my HF hunting and gathering trips.

HF sells these pliers for \$14.99. If these long-reach pliers can get you out of just one bad situation, they will have paid for themselves.

There are plenty of tight spots under the hood and around the engine where these pliers could prove useful—maybe on those spring-style hose clamps or to retrieve a dropped item that was sucked into an engine bay "black hole".



Around the house I can envision using these pliers to fish items out of the kitchen garbage disposal or down an HVAC vent register. Speaking of fish, maybe you fishermen need these pliers to remove that fish hook and bait that your lunker bass swallowed!

I found that it helps to give some HF hand tools a spritz of WD-40 to lubricate the pivot points and add some surface protection to ward off surface rust. I have had some HF tools develop surface rust while being stored in the garage and exposed to summer heat and humidity.

BUYING A CAR AT A MECUM AUCTION

Our story started when Phyllis decided to sell her 2012 Cadillac SRX last November. We were getting ready for a four month out-of-country trip and were on the waiting list to get a new Cadillac Lyriq at ELCO Cadillac, our Club Sponsor. The estimated vehicle delivery was to be around the time of our return home in May 2023.

With used car prices being high, we sold the SRX prior to our lengthy trip. On our return, we were informed that the delivery date for the Lyriq was now 6-12 months out! We decided to look for an interim car, something used, but well-maintained since we would drive it for no more than a year.

We had always said that many cars at a Mecum Auction would make good drivers. And, we were planning to go to the June Mecum Auction in Tulsa. So, we decided to take our own advice.



We arrived Thursday afternoon at the onsite RV Park with our trailer, checked in, and were ready to go Friday morning. The auction docket had five potential cars to bid on. The auction grounds opened at 8 am Friday and the auction started at 10 am, giving us 2 hours to examine the candidates.

Four of the cars were Mercedes-Benz CLK or SL models, and one was a BMW four-seat convertible. The BMW was the nicest looking, but closer examination showed an engine oil leak on the bottom of the car, a cracked windshield and a lot of rust in the engine compartment (flood or saltwater environment?). Scratch that one.

Two of the other Mercedes showed extensive rust with having been Florida cars per the associated Carfax report. Scratch those two. The 3rd Mercedes was painted red, but overall condition was poor.

The 4th was a 2008 Mercedes CLK350 Convertible and looked good. It had no oil leaks, no corrosion, good paint and interior, and only 83,000 miles. The convertible top looked new and it had a strong-sounding 3.5 liter V-6 engine. This car would be the one to bid on, with an auction estimate of \$15K to \$20K.

It was Lot 95, so it did not cross the auction block until after noon. To assist you with your bidding, you can ask one of the bidder's assistants to stop by your table when your car comes up for bid. Lot 95 arrived, and the bidding started. We had put a limit of \$15,000 as our high bid. Bidding started at \$5K and went up at \$1K increments.

The way the bidding worked out, someone else arrived at \$15K before we did, and the auctioneer was now asking for \$18K. Our bidder's assistant said to bid \$17K. We said no. He then suggested \$16K. We said if we did not get it at \$16K we would not bid higher. Surprise, we got it for \$16K!

We then proceeded to the Sales Office to complete the transaction. We went into a cubicle to write the check, get the bill of sale, and get approved to remove the vehicle from the floor. Since Mecum is a licensed car dealer in Oklahoma, we purchased a temporary tag for \$10 to drive it home. Since we were not leaving until Sunday, (purchased on Friday), we just left it in the Expo Center out of the weather until Sunday morning.

Sunday morning, we had second thoughts about driving it almost 300 miles home—not knowing the history of the car. Mecum does have its own transport service, so I asked the cost to ship it to Washington, Missouri. They quoted \$800 in an enclosed trailer, with delivery within 2 weeks. It seemed like cheap insurance instead of something bad happening on the road.

With that, we left Tulsa at 9 am and arrived home around 5 pm the same day. As I unhooked the trailer, I received a text saying that the car would be arriving around 8 pm that tonight! One of their trucks was going through Tulsa on its way to Detroit with one car, so he picked it up at 1:15 pm. Around 8:30 pm, the truck arrived. He unloaded it and parked it in the driveway. The other car in his trailer was a prototype covered in black and white camouflaged cloth to hide the details. He would not say what it was.

I have spent some time tweaking the car. The rear license plate holder had four stripped threads (replaced myself for \$5), the radio face plate was delaminating (replaced myself for \$40), replaced the two worn rear tires (\$300), replaced a missing tire jack pad block on the frame (\$10), two of the rear view mirrors were loose (tightened) and had the oil changed and got a state inspection. It took almost three weeks to get the title mailed to us, so having the Oklahoma temp tags allowed us to drive it around Missouri. When we received the title, it turned out that the car was consigned by a dealer in St. Charles, Missouri!

All in all, it was a very fun and exciting way to buy a car. Mecum does a great job from bidding to getting your car home. Do due diligence when inspecting a car. Bring a flashlight! I would buy another car from Mecum. What will we do when the Lyriq arrives? We will either trade it in or if they do not offer us enough, I may take it to a Mecum auction and sell it there with no reserve. With the tweaks I've done to it, perhaps we can get closer to \$20K?



MECUM AUCTION—MONTERY 1933 V-16 CADILLAC

The Mecum Monterey Auction that will be held August 17th to 19th lists for auction a 1933 Cadillac V-16 All-Weather Phaeton. As you can see below, this is a large and impressive vehicle.

While reading about the vehicle's story, something mentioned caught my eye. Per Mecum, "Of note, this body is one of only eight All-Weather Phaeton bodies produced by Fleetwood for 1933. Continuing to benefit from an older restoration, this regal Sixteen carries known ownership history including Jack Passey, Fred Weber, Jarvis Burton and the McGowan brothers."

Yes, it appears this impressive vehicle was once owned by former long-time St. Louis Region Club

member Fred Weber. Fred is now in his mid-90s. I reached out to Terry Wenger to ask if he recalled this car. Terry stated that he believed that Fred had owned the car and even displayed it in unfinished condition at one of our CLC-StL car shows when they were held at Tower Grove Park. Terry went on to say that he has pictures of many of Fred's cars but not of this particular car.


