Meeting Notes: Our Club meeting will be held at 11 am in the area where members' cars are displayed. There is a \$20 registration fee to display a car. This show is a fundraiser for the National Children's Cancer Society.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

<u>August Meeting</u>: Our August 20th meeting was held at the auto collection of Wayne and Melba Nolan. We had a great turnout of about 35 members and guests. After the meeting, many of us proceeded to the nearby Frankie Gianino's Restaurant for an early dinner and to extend our time for fellowship and enjoyment of the day.

Thank you, Director Todd, for proposing and arranging for our visit to the Nolans. And, a VERY BIG THANK YOU goes out to Wayne and Melba Nolan for allowing us to view their extensive and impressive collection! Their auto collection is very special for several reasons—it consist primarily of pre-war vehicles, of which most are in exquisite original or beautifully restored operating condition. The collection has many unusual makes, of which several were built in St. Louis. Prior to the Great Depression, St. Louis was a major producer of automobiles. At one point, St. Louis car manufacturing was second only to Detroit.

Dodge Brothers is one of the Nolans' favorite marques. There are representative examples of Dodge Brothers cars annually from 1915 to 1920, plus examples from 1927 and 1928. The collection also includes some less-common makes such a Dort, Gardner, Graham, Maxwell, Overland, Star, and Studebaker. One of the more recent acquisitions is a gorgeous burgundy 1935 Chrysler Imperial Airflow. Several pre-war Chevrolets and Fords were also displayed.

The collection also includes two Buicks as well as a Marquette—the lower-priced companion car to Buick as LaSalle was to Cadillac. While no Pontiacs were present, the collection does include an Oakland, which was GM's parent car brand to the lower-priced Pontiac companion brand. Oakland was discontinued in 1931—a victim of the Great Depression. Unlike the other GM companion brands, Pontiac continued on, earning the distinction of being the only GM make that was not an outside acquisition that survived for a significant period of time. Pontiac ceased production in 2010 in the aftermath of the Great Recession and GM's bankruptcy and reorganization.

My favorites were the St.-Louis-manufactured vehicles, which included four Moons from the early '20s with their Rolls Royce-like grills, and the robust-looking 1920 Traffic truck. Also St.-Louis-built were a 1932 Chevrolet Landau Phaeton and the body for a 1925 Star.

The Moons are a particular St.-Louis-built favorite. How can you not love their "Moon eye" logo that was later incorporated into Dean Moon's

similar-looking Moon and Mooneyes speed equipment logos in the early 1960s?

Recall that when Six Flags over Mid-America opened in 1971, one of the original eight rides were the gas-powered antique "Moon Cars" we then-youngsters could drive around a concrete and steel-rail track as we dreamed about obtaining our drivers licenses.

A quick Six-Flags memory of mine—my brother, Scott, named the "Screamin' Eagle" Roller Coaster. When opened in 1976, the Guinness World Records listed it as the tallest coaster at 110 feet high and the fastest coaster at 62 mph. My father was an account executive at the advertising firm that had the Six-Flags marketing account. They asked staff and their families to submit ideas for the name of the new roller coaster, and my brother's submission won! It helped that 1976 was America's Bicentennial and the eagle theme worked to his advantage. I had submitted "Screamin' Demon" and "Twin Peaks". Twin Peaks would later become the name of a TV show in the early '90s. Hmm, wonder if I can collect royalties?

In the almost 50-years since, a quick internet search now shows the world's fastest roller coaster as Formula Rossa, located at Ferrari World in Abu Dhabi, with a maximum speed of 149 mph and the world's tallest roller coaster as Falcon's Flight in Saudi Arabia with a height of 525 feet.

Wow, that was a huge rabbit hole that I fell into. My, how the mind wanders when fun is to be found. OK, now back to the collection tour.

Also on display were several post-wars cars including a 1965 Corvair (another favorite), a 1968 Chrysler 300 convertible and a 4th generation Corvette. Needless to say, all thoroughly enjoyed visiting the Nolan collection and basking in the neon-glow of Automobilia.

Director Todd started our Club meeting and stated that our Treasury balance remains about one Grant below a Madison (two denominations of paper currency no longer printed). Have I got you thinking?

Our next Club meeting will be held at the Wheels in Motion Charity Car Show in support of the National Children's Cancer Society. As in prior years, a Club donation was proposed, seconded and passed unanimously. A \$200 Club donation will be made to the National Children's Cancer Society. McPherson College's Automotive Restoration Program has been in our orbit the past year with our prior and recent donations.



WHAT MAKE, MODEL, AND YEAR CAR IS THIS?

Last month Clayton Patterson submitted photo's of a friend's grandfather's car and asked if anyone could identify the make, model and year of the car. Well, I blew the dust off of my stack of auto catalogs and picture books, put on my thinking tuque (beanie), and I think I have found the answer. Unfortunately, the car is neither a Cadillac nor LaSalle. In my opinion, this vehicle is a 1940 2-Door Chevrolet KH Master DeLuxe (or KB Master 85) Town Sedan T/B (Trunk Back). Below are snips of the submitted photos with the tattle-tale clues. What do you think? Have I gotten it right?









Comparing the photos of the subject car (left and above) to the four reference photos of a 1940 Chevrolet Master Town Sedan Trunk Back (at bottom of page) reveals the following similarities:

- 1) Upper-right: Chevrolet had fender mounted "add-on" headlight housings for 1939/40 only. Also note the top of headlight chrome trim and adjacent side marker light (gone for 1941) are a match.
- 2) Above: Hood side vents (7; various trim available) of this style were used in 1940/41, but 1941 models had the headlights fully incorporated into the fender sheetmetal stamping, so this must be a 1940. You can also see a hint of the long, bulbous, hood ornament.
- 3) Upper-left: Window drip rail and location, and hubcaps are similar.
- 4) Left: Side trim and door handle look similar. The split windshield, upright B-pillar, and both side window shapes and size are similar. The Running boards look similar.

I rest my case!

CADILLAC LAUNCHES CELEBRATION OF 20 YEARS OF V-SERIES PERFORMANCE

Cadillac is kicking off a year-long celebration for its V-Series performance sub-brand, which celebrates its 20th anniversary in 2024. The Cadillac V-Series performance sub-brand was launched at Sebring International Raceway in March 2004 with the race debut and subsequent first win of the CTS-V.R race car in the SCCA Pro Racing World Challenge GT race.

The inaugural production V-Series—the 2004 CTS-V—was developed on the racetrack and previewed on Germany's famed Nürburgring circuit. It was the first of 13 V-Series sedan, coupe, roadster and SUV models to follow. All V-Series vehicles benefit from the performance technologies and learnings from nearly 20 years of winning on the racetrack.


"Nearly 20 years ago, Cadillac made a bold move with V-Series that continues to resonate," said Global Vice President of Cadillac Rory Harvey. New products and features commemorating the 20th anniversary of V-Series are planned over the next 12 months, with more information to be announced throughout this period. The 20th anniversary celebration

will conclude at Sebring in March 2024—20 years after the first CTS-V won on the track.

Today's lineup includes the CT4-V and twin-turbocharged CT4-V Blackwing, the CT5-V, the supercharged CT5-V Blackwing, and the supercharged Escalade-V. With 682 horsepower, the Escalade-V currently wears the crown of most-powerful Cadillac's production model ever, while the CT4-V and CT5-V Blackwing models offer the ultimate balance of road-going performance luxury and track capability.


