In addition to our January 6th post-holiday lunch and meeting at Favazza's, first-half 2024 meetings and events known at this time are:

- March ??; CLC-StL Meeting: The March meeting plans are still pending at this time. Once determined they will be communicated as quickly as possible by a specific email and/ or the March newsletter.
- March 31st; HCCMo Easter Auto Show: Sunday, Forest Park, St. Louis, MO. The renowned Horseless Carriage Club Easter Auto Show at Forest Park is fast approaching. Easter falls very early this year. Last year the Club had a formal presence at the show for the first time in many years with approximately 20 vehicles displayed. Director Todd is planning another Club display this year. The HCCMo requests that club displays include at least 10 vehicles. Todd states we will have a similar Muny Opera Upper Parking Lot location as last year, with 1½ spaces allotted for each registered vehicle. 2023 CLC GRAND NATIONAL (Part 4)

The word must have gotten around about a "Brougham" gathering in Albuquerque. A supernice selection of the last of the land yachts of the '70s, '80s, and early '90s were in all their glory, representing the last of a breed of large, luxury, rear wheel drive vehicles from Cadillac. Some may question, why do you want a land yacht? In reply, one may say, would you rather have a dinghy? Yes, size does matter!

Present were almost identical twins, a pair of 1976 Fleetwood Broughams—both in Phoenician Ivory (light yellow). The one with a buckskin vinyl top was owned by collector Mike Steiner of Palm Springs, CA. Mike and his extended family collect only luxury cars of the 1970s. To date, he has about 40 in his stable.



The twin was owned by Nick Manole (Mr. Fleetwood) and had a lighter shade of vinyl top. Luxury abounds with the "pillow" cushioned seats—like riding along on your living room sofa.



Continuing the grand-style, formal design, the popular Brougham finally shed its anemic HT 4100 (249 cubic inches) engine for a larger five-liter (307 cubic inches) cast iron V-8 in 1986.

Like a kid in a candy store or a socialite at Tiffany's, these opulent beauties came in a variety of colors and options. Longtime member Fred Butalla of IL drove his triple-yellow 1986 to the show. A family car since new, it is no stranger to CLC shows and events. (see top of next page).

Mr. Fleetwood, Nick Manole, entered his original Sapphire Blue-metallic 1990 Brougham d'Elegance



sedan (pictured below)—taking home a preservation award and 2nd place in the touring divisions. Those optional, real-wire wheels added extra bling and an extra \$1000.00 to the price tag.



Hiding out from the mainstream was a polar-white '90 Brougham, owned by Jim Jordan of OK. Entered for display only, this beautiful car was still a trophy winner in anyone's eyes.




Taking the long-distance driver award from Long Island, NY was a navy-blue 1990 d'Elegance, owned by William Estes. This gorgeous car showed little wear for the long jaunt to Albuquerque. He certainly knows how to remove those bugs from the grill!



Desire a formal-black version? Look no farther than the 1991 Brougham d'Elegance with optional wire wheels and gold-line Vogue tires. The d'Elegance option added an extra \$2896 to the base price of \$30,225. The Karreman family of AZ proudly accepted the preservation and 1st place primary awards. Congrats on a well-deserved trophy and a gorgeous automobile.



The majestic, reddish/copper-colored 1991 Brougham driven by Joe Kausse of KS had some mechanical issue and was unceremoniously towed out, repaired as new, and returned to the show field for judging. With all that aggravation, his pride-and-joy took 2nd place in the touring class—well worth the trip.



1993 through 1996 models were the final years of the RWD Broughams, featuring a new aerodynamic design, large, wide chrome fender spears (skirts) and a new 5.7-liter (350 cubic inch) engine—compliments of Chevrolet.

Two magnificent entries graced the field—first, a 1994 deep-ruby/maroon-metallic with contrasting black padded roof, with optional chrome wheels (\$1195) from Salt Lake City, UT.



And its sibling, a 1995 fully-optioned Champaign Mist model from IN, made the trip just to be displayed, not judged. (see top of next page).

ANDRETTI GLOBAL AND GENERAL MOTORS TEAM UP IN F1 PURSUIT

Andretti Global and General Motors, two American powerhouses in the automotive and motorsport sectors, have announced their intent to pursue the opportunity to compete in the FIA Formula One World Championship. GM would be represented by the Cadillac brand. The Andretti Cadillac team would be based in the U.S. with a support facility in the U.K.

This reunites two iconic American companies with deep motorsports pedigrees and provides the opportunity to build on previous racing accomplishments while expanding international reach for both brands. F1 has seen consistent growth globally and most recently in the U.S. with 2023 races in Austin, Miami and Las Vegas.



The Andretti Cadillac team is planning to submit an Expression of Interest when the FIA opens the formal process. If selected, the team is seeking to compete as soon as practical with at least one American driver.

Cadillac V-Series has a legacy of success on the track in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship and Pirelli World Challenge. Since 2017, Cadillac has been competing at the forefront of American sports car racing in IMSA, achieving numerous wins, podiums, and championships with the Cadillac DPi-V.R. Cadillac will continue in sports car racing with the all-new hybrid Cadillac V-LMDh, which will compete globally in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship and FIA World Endurance Championship.

Andretti Global is a global racing enterprise and parent company to Andretti Autosport and other Andretti racing ventures. Andretti racing teams currently compete in seven different top-tier series worldwide and have found success in each avenue of competition.

Andretti and GM last paired for the return of Chevrolet to the NTT INDYCAR SERIES in 2012, together capturing nine wins across two seasons. The pairing additionally claimed the Driver, Team and Manufacturer titles in 2012.

Michael Andretti, Chairman and CEO, Andretti Global:

"We are continuing to grow Andretti Global and its family of racing teams and always have our eyes on what's next. I feel very strongly that we are suited to be a new team for Formula One and can bring value to the series and our partners, and excitement for the fans. I'm proud to have GM and Cadillac alongside us as we pursue this goal. GM and Andretti share a legacy born out of the love of racing. We now have the opportunity to combine our motorsport passions and dedication to innovation to build a true American F1 bid.

Together, we will continue to follow procedures and steps put forth by the FIA during the evaluation process. In the meantime, we continue to optimistically prepare should we be fortunate enough to have Andretti Cadillac formally approved as a Formula One contender."

PRODUCT REVIEW SILICONE TOOL TRAY

I know many of you are waiting with bated breath for the next enthralling tool review article on my latest pliers acquisition. Calm down; I will have some more pliers reviews in the near future.

This is a product review of the Menards Masterforce® Nonslip Silicone Nesting 3-Piece Tool Tray Set. I know what you are thinking, why would I need that? You already have your fender cover to prevent paint scratches leaning over the fender while working inside the engine bay, right...?

Have you noticed those things can be slicker than snot? You lay your tools or hardware on the fender cover, and they slide off, rolling under the car or into the engine bay, making retrieval difficult.

These silicone trays are flexible and grippy, with compartments to hold your tools and hardware. The trays are very thick and have some weight for their size. They are definitely non-slip, both on the fender as well as holding your tools and parts.

This set's regular price is \$17.99 and is a great value. Your favorite Asian tool store sells these individually for a combined price of \$42. The only difference I can tell is theirs are blue and these are Kelly green. St. Patrick's Day is coming up soon...treat yourself; this is no blarney!
